Worship On-Stage Wardrobe Guidelines for Ladies

Tops and Layering Pieces

- Modern, feminine blouses that covers your bottom
- Clothes should be well fitting; looser fit for tops is best, however nothing should be baggy, hanging off shoulders
- Dark t-shirts that are not overly-tight on bust or stomach
 - Layer t-shirt with jackets, denim, kimonos, blazers, cardigans
- White does well when layered under darker neutrals or earth tones.
- o No:
 - tank tops, cap sleeves, spaghetti straps
 - front-tucked in shirts to highwaist pants

Pants

- Well-fitting, dark wash jeans, pants, slacks or chinos
- o Below the knee length skirts or dresses
- No athletic apparel, sweats of any kind, or items meant for working out or lounging

Shoes

- Low Heels or shoe with a Wedge
- We don't recommend stilettos; pick a heel that is more comfortable & chunky so you can still move around without feeling unstable.
- Clean, trendy sneakers and flats are acceptable if your outfit looks professional and excellent
- Again, we want you to look your best AND be able to worship unhindered by your choice of clothing/shoes.

Accessories

Jewelry (should be modest and undistracting)

Overall Look

- Hair should be well kept, brushed, and nicely fixed.
- o Face should be fresh and eyes clear.
- Makeup should ALWAYS be worn on stage, for the sake of the camera. This includes lipstick and mascara. Makeup should be well blended and subtle with no bold hues or tones.
- Clothes should be seasonally appropriate, however layering even in the warmer months is recommended.

Camera Tips

- Neutral, dark, and earth tones look great on camera!
- Prints that are too busy, too tight, or apparel with crazy logos don't do well on camera.
- Bright white and red don't partner well on camera, no matter the lighting or your skin tone.

Simple Tips:

Layering pieces can help achieve a polished look

- Spruce up your "normal wear" by adding a statement piece like a necklace, ring or jewelry piece.
- The most important thing is for you to look professional. When in doubt bring a spare jacket with you in case.
