PREMARITAL COUNSELING & WEDDING MANUAL

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Note: Bethany facilities are available for the wedding ceremony only and not available for receptions.

"Haven't you read," he replied, "that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female,' and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh? So they are no longer two, but one. Therefore, what God has joined together, let man not separate." (Matthew 19:4-6)

At Bethany we believe marriage is honorable and holy before God. It is on this premise that we have prepared the following handbook. It contains the policies and procedures we feel are important to you, our Bethany Pastoral Team, to help guide you through premarital counseling, preparation and planning.

PREMARITAL PROCEDURES

When an engaged couple requests information on getting married or having premarital counseling, they will need to set an appointment with an available pastor or the pastor they request for a premarital interview. A pastor will meet with the couple for the premarital interview to determine the eligibility of the couple to be married based on Bethany criteria. A Premarital Counseling Form must be filled out completely, by both the couple and the pastor.

If the couple meets the criteria to participate in premarital counseling, the pastor will need to communicate with Pastoral Support and indicate if he will be doing the counseling or if a Counseling Couple will be needed. We have trained a number of couples from each campus to do premarital counseling. This provides a couple the option to have counseling after hours since their work schedules usually conflict with the pastors' office hours for counseling. If a counseling couple will be used, Pastoral Support will connect the two parties and make all arrangements. If the pastor will be counseling he may schedule the appointments or Pastoral Support will do so on the Pastoral Care Calendar.

The pastor will turn in the Interview Form to Pastoral Support and if the couple would like to hold their ceremony at Bethany's facilities then a copy of the Interview Form should be forwarded to Bethany's wedding events coordinator. The wedding coordinator will use this form to contact the couple about their wedding plans.

If ineligibility is determined based on Bethany criteria, recommendations will be made to the couple as to their next step.

Couples must successfully complete all aspects of the premarital counseling program. This program is designed to help the couple gain a deeper and more complete understanding of their relationship as well as their commitments and roles in a covenant marriage. The counseling sessions are to be scheduled throughout the engagement period.

Both premarital counseling and wedding plans could be forfeited and/or postponed for any of the following reasons:

• The couple discovers significant unresolved issues during counseling, and the pastor determines that they should no longer pursue marriage.

- The couple falls into sexual sin during the engagement period.
- The couple decides that they no longer desire to be married.

If the wedding is forfeited or postponed for any reason, the Bethany pastor will contact the Bethany wedding coordinator, and all Bethany reservations will be released and the security deposit returned. New wedding dates may not be selected until such a time as the reason for forfeiture has been resolved.

If you have questions, need assistance or have never done premarital counseling or been trained on reading the compatibility assessment please contact Pastor Chuck Stearns for training and information.

Wedding Policy

Couples planning to marry at Bethany Church must be advised of the following guidelines:

- In accordance with Bethany Church by laws, we recognize the biblical definition of marriage as a union between one man and one woman, and that romantic and sexual contact between the same sex is sinful according to Romans 1:26-27 and 1 Corinthians 6:9-10.
- All weddings performed at Bethany facilities must have a Bethany pastor officiating. Guest pastors
 may assist in the ceremony or must obtain special permission to perform the ceremony.
- Bethany requires couples to obtain a covenant marriage license if a Bethany Pastor is officiating. By
 law we must provide the couple with a copy of the Covenant Marriage Act (included in the folder
 for each couple that is provided to the counselor) and must appear before a Notary with the
 Declaration of Intent and Covenant Marriage Affidavit of Attestation signed by the counselor.
- The couple must have a minimum three-month engagement period. During the three months, the couple must successfully complete five premarital sessions.
- Second-marriage weddings are distinctly different in style from first-time weddings. When applicable, the officiating pastor will outline the ceremony guidelines for a second marriage.

*** If a couple's ceremony is not held in a state where the Covenant Marriage Act is available then it is not a requirement to obtain a Covenant Marriage License.

Counseling Procedures:

- The interviewing pastor will make sure the initial interview form is filled out completely and turned in to pastoral support admin. PS Admin will use this form as information to provide necessary materials, etc.
- If the couple is requesting to use a Bethany facility for the ceremony, the interviewer needs
 to email needs to the Events department right away to let them know the name and
 contact info of the couple and that an interview has been done and the couple is approved.
 The couple will then need to contact the Events department to make their reservations and
 arrangements.
- There is an \$80 fee for the premarital materials to be turned in to the pastoral support admin. This materials fee covers the cost of books and the online Symbis assessment.
- Pastoral Support admin. will create a folder with all forms, assessments and materials for each couple and give it to the pastor/counselor. It is very important that upon completion of the counseling that the pastor/counselor turn the folder with the remaining contents back into PS admin.

 Premarital counseling consists of the pastor/counselor going through the book "Called Together" and going over the Symbis compatibility assessment with the couple. This should take approximately 6 weeks.

- Called together (book) bride and groom each get a copy
- Act of Marriage (book) bride and groom each get a copy after counseling is completed and only a week prior to the wedding

Reserving Bethany Facilities

Reserving Bethany facilities for a wedding must be done through our Bethany Events Coordinator. To arrange a meeting, call the offices at 225-293-2100.

Wedding Fees

Subject to change due to updates so please check on this before giving out the info. You can always direct them to call Events for accurate info.

- A \$200 deposit is required to hold the wedding date. This will be applied toward the damage deposit if you choose to keep your date. Otherwise, it will be forfeited.
- A \$500 damage deposit is due 30 days prior to the wedding date. This will be reimbursed to you minus any damages 30 days after the wedding date.
- There will be a \$200 per hour charge for each additional hour of facility use <u>not</u> reserved in advance. This fee will come out of the damage deposit if the facility is not vacated in the allotted time.

The price of the weddings include:

- Audio Engineer Services
- Event Coordinator Services
- Facility Manager Services (to be present at event)
- Cleaning
- Two dressing rooms: one for Bride, one for Groom
- · One hour rehearsal (night before the wedding)
- Five hours the day of the wedding (including set-up, ceremony, and takedown)
- The total cost is due 30 days prior to the wedding.

ADDITIONAL HOURS- There is a \$100 per hour fee for additional hours arranged in advance. This can be requested through the Events Coordinator when scheduling your wedding date.

SECURITY - Security can be added to your event at a rate of \$35/hr per officer if requested.

COVENANT MARRIAGE INFORMATION

Louisiana Laws on Community Property and Covenant Marriage

Louisiana law, LA-R.S. 9:237, has empowered the attorney general to prepare, for the local officers who issue marriage licenses, a summary of the community property laws and the covenant marriage laws of this state, with the mandate to these local officers to deliver this summary to each prospective spouse when they receive their license to marry. This pamphlet contains the summary of

It should be understood at the outset that this pamphlet only briefly summarizes the law so that the prospective spouses can have a general idea of what the Louisiana law on these topics contains. For a more detailed analysis on precisely how these laws affect their individual circumstances and what may be the best way to maneuver through this legal pathway, prospective spouses should consult their private attorneys.

LOUISIANA'S COMMUNITY PROPERTY LAW AND HOW TO CHANGE ITS EFFECTS BY CONTRACT

In Louisiana, marriage affects the property rights of both men and women. The rights of married people to buy, sell or control their property, to borrow money, and to get credit are all regulated by law. "Property" includes almost everything; house, land, bank accounts, stock, pension plans, wages and other income and things of value. A married couple becomes subject to Louisiana's community property law automatically upon marrying, unless they have made a special contract providing different rules to govern their property.

What is community property?

The community property laws provide rules on who may incur debts, how those debts are to be paid, and how debts and assets are to be divided between the husband and wife if their community ends

Marriage Contracts

A couple may make a written marriage contract before the wedding which sets out how they want their property owned and controlled. A marriage contract written before marriage does not need court approval for its provisions that are in accordance with Louisiana law to be enforceable. Married people from another state who move into Louisiana, and who do not wish to have their property become community property, have one year after they move to Louisiana to make amriage contract to that effect without a judge's approval. Their contract is also governed by the Louisiana law on separation of property, so the contract is valid if it is in accordance with relevant Louisiana law. Of course, after the first year, they too may enter a separation of property agreement with court approval.

Remembe

By law, marriage changes our property rights. The community property law will apply to you if you do not make a special marriage contract. You may make this special contract before or after you are married, but some contracts written after marriage require a judge's approval to be legal. If you were married outside of Louisiana, moving here has changed your property rights. You have one year form the date you moved to make a marriage contract without a judge's approval. The contract must be signed by the man and woman in the presence of a Notary Public and two witnesses or executed by a private signature duly acknowledged. You should see a lawyer so that you will know how the taxes on your property and the inheritance of your property may be changed by your marriage.

THE COVENANT MARRIAGE ACT

What is covenant marriage?

The law describes a covenant marriage as a marriage entered into by one male and one female who understand and agree that the marriage between them is a lifelong relationship.

How does a couple enter into a covenant marriage?

In order to enter into a covenant marriage, the couple must take special steps and execute and record special documents on the public record.

The law provides that a man and woman may contract a covenant marriage by declaring their intent to do so on their application for a marriage license and executing a declaration of intent to contract a covenant marriage and then, of course, actually getting married accordingly. The application for a marriage license and the declaration of intent shall be filed with the official who issues the marriage license.

The declaration of intent to contract a covenant marriage shall contain all of the following:

- A recitation signed by both parties
- An affidavit by the parties attesting they have received premarital counseling from a priest, minister, rabbi, clerk of the Religious Society of Friends, any clergyman of any religious sect, or a professional marriage counselor. The seriousness of covenant marriage shall be included in the discussion during counseling.
- An attestation signed by the counselor and attached to or included in the parties' affidavit, confirming that the parties were counseled as to the nature and purpose of the marriage.

- The signature of both parties witnessed by a notary.
- If one or both of the parties are minors, the written consent or authorization of those persons required under the Children's Code to consent to or authorize the marriage of minors

Thus, the declaration shall contain two separate documents, the recitation and the affidavit of the parties to marriage, the latter of which shall include the attestation of the premarital counselor, either included therein or attached thereto. The recitation of the parties shall be prepared in duplicate originals, one of which shall be retained by the parties and the other, together with the affidavit and attestation, shall be filed with the official who issues the marriage license.

The law also stipulates a method by which already married couples may convert their marriage from a "standard" marriage into a covenant marriage by designating it so. This method is very similar to the method by which covenant marriage is entered into in the first instance, but, in this declaration of intent, the two spouses renew their original marriage promise to love, honor, and care for one another as husband and wife for the rest of their lives and, of course, instead of "premarital counseling," they simply undergo the covenant marriage counseling prior to designating their marriage as a covenant marriage. The declaration of intent and other documents are filed with the state officer who issued their original marriage license and who maintains the record of their marriage certificate. If they were originally married out of state, they file a copy of their marriage certificate from the other state, which does not have to be certified, together with the covenant marriage documents, with the, officer who issues marriage license in the parish in which they are domiciled. The officer will then make a notation on the copy of the out-of-state marriage certificate that a declaration of intent has been filed by the couple to designate their marriage as a covenant marriage.

What are some of the special incidents and effects of a covenant marriage?

The law provides that the spouses to a covenant marriage owe to each other the same legal obligations as couples in a "standard" marriage, but it also provides, in addition, some special rules. Essentially, these special rules include the following: spouses owe each other love and respect and they commit to a community of living; spouses are bound to live together, unless there is good cause otherwise; the spouses determine the family residence by mutual consent, according to their requirements and those of the family; the management of the household shall be the right and duty of both spouses; and spouses by mutual consent after collaboration should make decisions relating to family life in the best interest of the family.

An extremely important and special incident and effect of a covenant marriage is that each of the parties to the covenant marriage has voluntarily declared, "If we experience marital difficulties, we commit ourselves to take all reasonable efforts to preserve our marriage, including marriage counseling". It should be noted that not only formal marital counseling, if needed, be undertaken by the spouses in times of marital difficulties but also all other reasonable steps as well be observed.

What are the grounds for a covenant marriage divorce?

1) The other spouse has committed adultery. 2) The other spouse has committed a felony and has been sentenced to death or imprisonment at hard labor. 3) The other spouse has abandoned the matrimonial domicile for a period of one year and constantly refuses to return. 4) The other spouse has physically or sexually abused the spouse seeking the divorce or a child of one of the spouses. 5) The spouses have been living separate and apart continuously without reconciliation for a period of two years. 6) The spouses have been living separate and apart continuously without reconciliation for a period of one year from the date of the judgment of separation from bed and board was signed. 7) If there is a minor child or children of the marriage, the spouses have been living separate and apart continuously without reconciliation for a period of one year and six months from the date the judgment of separation from bed and board was signed; however, if abuse of a child of the marriage or a child of one of the spouses is the basis for which the judgment of separation from bed and board was obtained, then a judgment of divorce may be obtained if the spouses have been living separate and apart continuously without reconciliation for a period of one year from the date the judgment of separation from bed and board was signed.

Instead of an immediate divorce, a separation form bed and board may be obtained. The grounds for a judgment of separation from bed and board are as follows:

1) The other spouse has committed adultery. 2) The other spouse has committed a felony and has been sentenced to death or imprisonment at hard labor. 3) The other spouse has abandoned the matrimonial domicile for a period of one year and constantly refuses to return. 4) The other spouse has physically or sexually abused the spouse seeking the divorce or a child of one of the spouses. 5) The spouses have been living separate and apart continuously without reconciliation for a period of two years. 6) On account of habitual intemperance of the other spouse, or excesses, cruel treatment, or outrages of the other spouse, if such habitual intemperance, or such ill-treatment is of such a nature as to render their living together insupportable.

MARRIAGE OFFICIANT'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The person who performs the marriage ceremony, the officiant, should:

Know the state regulations regarding the performance of a marriage, including any registration requirements for officiants.

Complete the officiant's portion of the marriage certificate (items 32 through 39) by entering the date, time place of marriage and his or her signature, name, title and address.

Obtain signatures of bride, groom/applicants and witnesses (items 40A through 41B) on marriage certificate.

THE LICENSE MUST BE RETURNED TO THIS OFFICE WITHIN TEN (10) DAYS.

In accordance with **LSA-R.S. 9:254**, which reads in part -"Any person authorized to perform marriages in this state who fails to complete the forms provided by the Department of Social Services,...or fails to file the two executed copies with the Clerk of Court...,within ten days after the date of the marriage as provided by law, shall be fined...,and the offender shall be prohibited thereafter from officiating at any marriage in this state."

FOR PRESERVATION AND MAINTENANCE PURPOSES, A MARRIAGE APPLICATION MUST BE SIGNED IN BLACK OR BLUE INK. IT WILL BE REJECTED IF IT IS SIGNED IN ANYTHING OTHER THAN BLACK OR BLUE INK.

TORN, TAPED OR SOILED MARRIAGE LICENSES WILL BE REJECTED.

CELEBRATION OF MARRIAGE

- A marriage ceremony shall not be performed until a (TWENTY FOUR) hour period has elapsed between the time of Issuance of the license and the proposed ceremony. **If there is a serious or grave reason for performing the marriage within a shorter period of time, the Family Court Judge may waive the time period.
- The ceremony must be performed in the presence of two(2) witnesses, age 18 or older. The witnesses must sign lines 41A and 41B
 on the marriage license in black or blue ink.
- 3. The bride and groom must sign lines 40A & 40B, respectively in black or blue ink.
- 4. The official must complete lines 32 through 39 in black or blue ink.
- 5. The ceremony may be religious or civil. Clergyman must be registered in the parish in which they principally perform, however the registration is effective for the entire state of Louisiana.
- 6. Lines 32 through 41B must be filled in completely and in black or blue ink.
- 7. The license (both white copies) should be returned to the Clerk of Court within 10 days after the ceremony has been performed.

The Bureau of Vital Records will return all licenses not filled in completely and correctly.

Lines 32 through 41B should be completed in black or blue ink.

- 8. The "Gold Leaf Certificate" is your copy of the marriage license and should not be mailed to the Clerk of Court. This certificate is to be filled in by the witnesses, bride and groom, and the officiant in the appropriate spaces in <u>black ink</u>. This **DOES NOT** serve as a certified copy of your marriage license.
- For certified copies of your marriage license, mall a cashier's check or money order (NO PERSONAL CHECKS) made payable to the "Clerk of Court" in the amount of \$10.00 to:

Most wedding ceremonies contain most of these elements. This is only an <u>example</u> to assist with helping couples plan their ceremony, not to be interpreted as an official order of service.

- 1. Wedding processional or entrance of the bride and groom, and wedding party if applicable
- 2. Music, literature, and poetry or wedding readings from the Bible
- 3. Attendants or witnesses to sign the wedding certificate or marriage license
- 4. Wedding Vows
- 5. Exchange of wedding rings or gifts
- 6. A blessing, benediction, community commitment to support the marriage, or officiates sanction of the marriage
- 7. A first kiss as a married couple
- 8. A recessional

Some weddings also include a unity candle ceremony or other unity ceremony.

Here are samples of a wedding ceremony:

PROCESSIONAL

OPENING WORDS OF THE OFFICIATE

The wedding should begin by welcoming your guests.

Dearly Beloved, we are gather	red here today in the presence of these witnesses, to join
and	_ in matrimony, which is commended to be honorable among all men;
and therefore - is not by any -	to be entered into unadvisedly or lightly - but reverently, discreetly

Another variation is:

Friends, we have been invited here today to share with _____ and _____ a very important moment in their lives. In the years they have been together, their love and understanding of each other has grown and matured, and now they have decided to live their lives together as husband and wife.

THE GIVING IN MARRIAGE (optional)

The traditional wording is "Who gives this woman to be wedded to this man"

AN OPENING PRAYER OR READING

This will generally set the tone of your wedding. It could be serious, humorous, sentimental, or elegant. Typically, it says something about love, relationships, or marriages.

DEFINITION OF MARRIAGE

Here the officiant says some words about marriage in general. He will most likely talk about the seriousness of the solemn vow you are about to make, and the new life together you are creating.

SECOND READING OR SONG

EXCHANGE OF RINGS OR GIFTS

The bride and groom say something like "I (name) give you (name) this ring as an eternal symbol of my love and commitment to you."

LIGHTING OF UNITY CANDLE, COMMUNION, OR OTHER UNITY CEREMONY (optional)

Many couples are choosing to add a unity ceremony. They may choose to do this in silence, with music playing or they may create vows to say about the joining of their families.

CLOSING

This could be a poem, a prayer, or a sanctioning of the marriage. It is generally the "final thoughts" of the officiate.

DECLARATION OF MARRIAGE

The officiate typically says something akin to "By the power vested in me by the State of ______, I now pronounce you husband and wife". This is followed by the first kiss of the newly married couple. The officiate will say "You may now kiss the bride".

INTRODUCTION OF NEWLYWEDS

The officiant says "I present to you Mr. and Mrs. ______". The guests stand and applaud, as the couple then lead the recessional.

ANOTHER OPTION:

Who gives this woman to be married to this man?

Dearly beloved, we are gathered here in the sight of God and in the face of this company, to join together this man and this woman in holy matrimony which is commended of the Bible to be honorable among all men; and therefore is not by any to be entered into unadvisedly or lightly; but reverently, and in the fear of God. Into this holy estate these come now to be joined together.

Read Ephesians 5:21-28

Marriage is a covenant relationship, not a contract.

A covenant is based on trust between parties...a contract is based on distrust. A covenant is based on unlimited responsibility...a contract is based on limited liability. A covenant cannot be broken if new circumstances occur...a contract can be voided by mutual consent.
